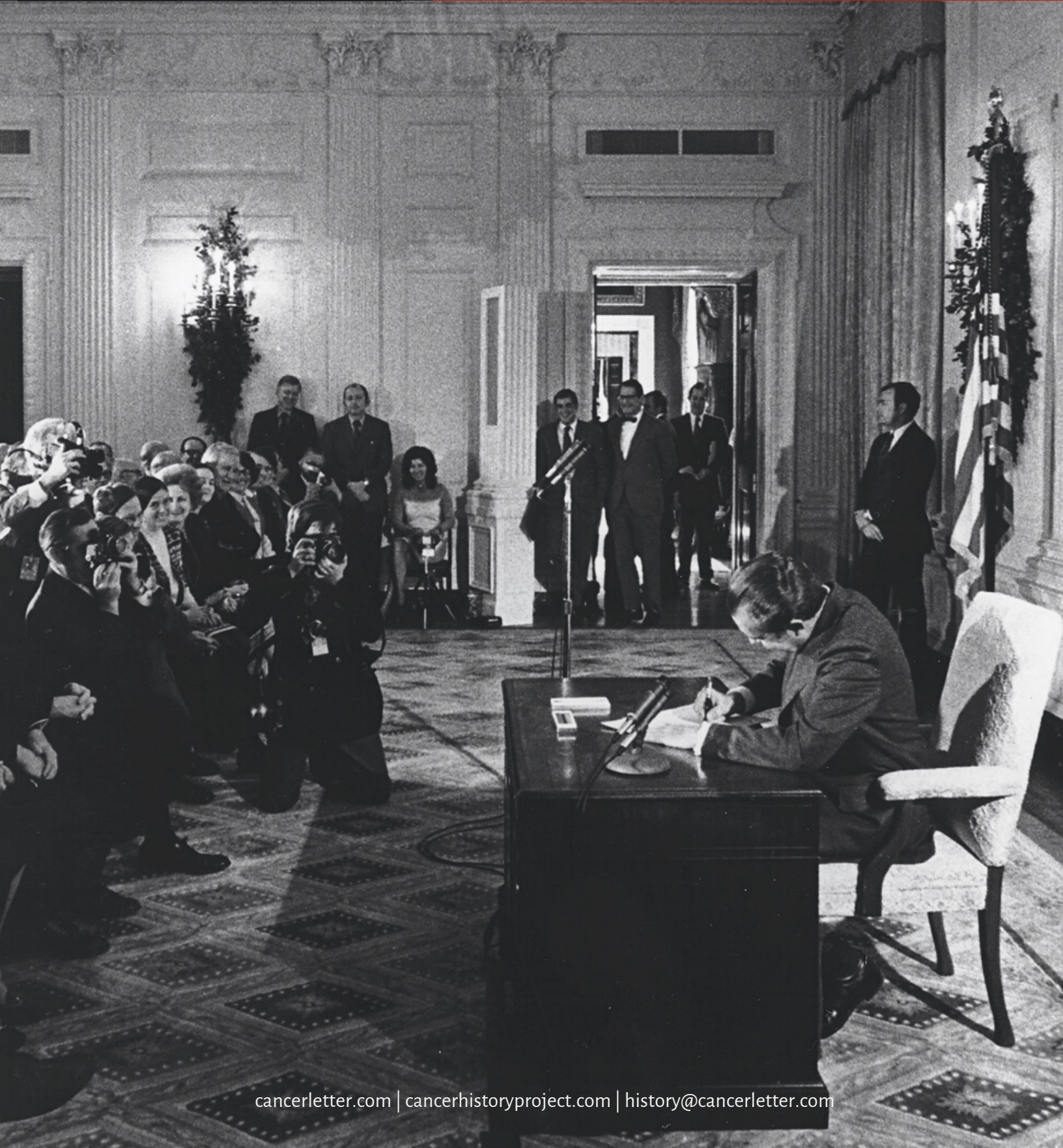

Approved contributors can publish directly to the site, preserving their history.

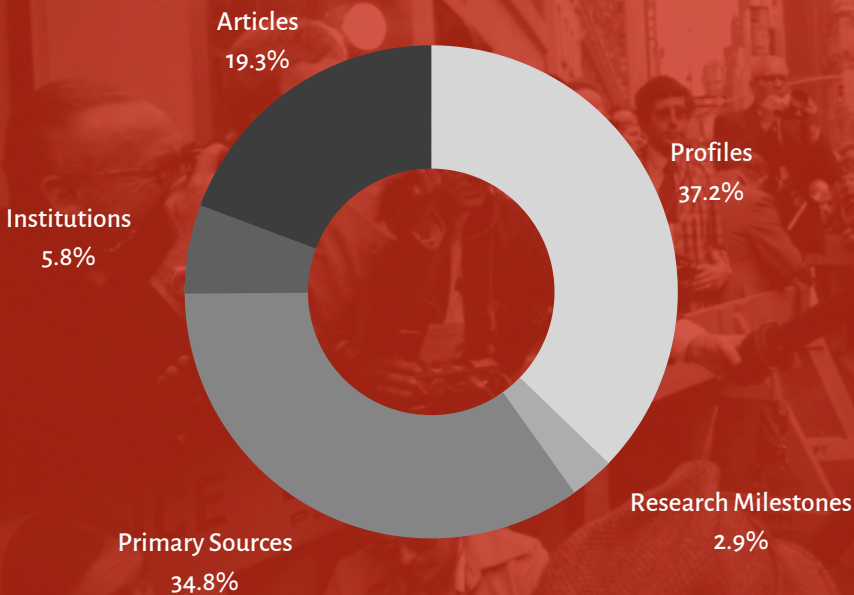
a dialogue
